Shrinathji, is a swarup of lord Krishna which resembles his 7-year-old "infant" incarnation of Krishna. The deity was originally worshiped at Mathura and was shifted in the year 1672 from Govardhan hill. Nathdwara means 'Gateway to Shrinathji (God)'.

The event spanned nine days from 29th July to 6th August 2023 at Shiv Murti parisar, 120 feet road, Nathdwara district Rajsamand. It aimed to showcase the rich and diverse craftsmanship of India, promoting traditional arts and crafts, and providing a platform for artisans to display their exquisite creations.
